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# Cliff Inn Demolished For Medical Buildings

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**EL PASO, Texas** -- At it's height, the Cliff Inn in Central El Paso was one of the places to stay. On Wednesday night, much of it turned to rubble.

Evangelina Quezada has lived in a home below the inn for 42 years.

"That is where we had two parties, and they were very kind to us, the hotel employees," Quezada told KFOX.

Quezada said she celebrated a birthday and her 35th wedding anniversary there, but she is not necessarily sad to see it go.

"All memories must pass, therefore I don't hold onto many things," said Quezada.

"This has been a landmark of El Paso since the 50s, and everybody that got ill came to Pill Hill. Well now when they come to Pill Hill, they are going to be coming to a brand-new, state-of-the-art medical facilities," said Russ Vandenburg with TVO North America, the company building the new medical facilities.

Vandenburg said El Paso deserves a higher level of medical care.

"Plans are to build two new medical office buildings of over 80,000 square feet each, and the potential of a new hospital up here," he said.

Edward Assi will move into the new building upon completion.

"Being able to offer a patient a one-stop shop, being able to come in and get all of their health care needs answered at one place," he said.

That is something Quezada likes to hear.

"Those buildings are good, because I remember when they put up that hotel, they took away a lot of medical buildings," she said.

The demolition will take about 90 days, with the new buildings completed in the next 18 to 36 months.

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
